

TRAFFIC CONTROL PROGRAM

1. PURPOSE

- a. This program is written to be in compliance with local regulatory requirements and provides directives to managers, supervisors, and employees about their responsibilities during traffic control operations.

2. SCOPE

- a. This program applies to all **H2 Enterprises, LLC (H2)** employees, temporary employees and contractors. When work is performed on a non-owned or operated site, the operator's program shall take precedence, however, this document covers **H2** employees and contractors and shall be used on owned premises, or when an operator's program doesn't exist or is less stringent.

3. REQUIREMENTS

a. Control Measures

- i. Traffic control signs and devices must be positioned and used as specified by the local, state or federal requirements. Signs and devices must be located so as to allow traffic to move by or through the work area in a controlled manner and, if necessary, to come to a controlled stop with due regard for the prevailing weather and road conditions. A sign advising of a traffic control person ahead must be placed in advance of each traffic control person's station, and this sign must be removed promptly when a traffic control person is no longer on duty at that station.

b. Personnel Locations

- i. A traffic control person must:
 1. Stand in a safe position, preferably on the driver's side of the lane under the TCP's control, be clearly visible, and have an unobstructed view of approaching traffic, and Be positioned at least 80 ft. (25 m) away from the work area unless circumstances or space requirements, such as working at or near an intersection, dictate otherwise.

c. PPE

- i. In addition to the standard company and customer required PPE, traffic control personnel must wear Class 2 or 3 high visibility clothing dependent on the speed of traffic on the road, day or night conditions as well as local, state or federal requirements.

d. Communication

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- i. If there is more than one traffic control employee working, each employee will be provided a suitable and effective means of communicating with the other traffic control personnel (i.e. two-way radios)

4. TRAINING

- a. All employees that are assigned to traffic control duties will be trained in the proper procedures and safe work practices for that work type. The training will be documented and kept on file.
